Oklahoma Voices book club series begins Feb. 4

OKLAHOMA CITY – Since publishing its first book in 1975, the Oklahoma Heritage Association has become the leader in publishing Oklahoma’s history. With more than 100 titles under its belt, the Association will host its book club series, Oklahoma Voices, which focuses on its publications about the lives and accomplishments of Oklahoma’s people.

Authors will be on hand to provide an insightful look into their publications and join in the discussion with attendees. The series is held the first Wednesday of each month (February through May) from 12:10 to 12:50 p.m. at the Gaylord-Pickens Oklahoma Heritage Museum.

“Through each of the Association’s programs, the Gaylord-Pickens Oklahoma Heritage Museum and our publications, we strive to tell Oklahoma’s story through its people, which we believe is our state’s greatest asset,” Campbell said. “Oklahoma Voices allows us to share the importance of our history and our people with the community.”

The first event in the spring series will be held Feb. 4 and features Peter G. Pierce, author of *Baseball in the Cross Timbers: The Story of the Sooner State League*.

Discounts on Pierce’s book and door prizes will be given. An RSVP is required, and the cost is \$10, which includes lunch.

On March 4, participants will lunch with Bob Burke and Gini Moore Campbell, authors of *Lee Allen Smith; Oklahoma’s Best Friend*. Author Larry Lewis will make an appearance April 1 to talk about *Struggles in the New State; The 1910 Journey of the Abernathy Boys as a Framework of Political Issues and Societal Changes in Oklahoma*. May 6 will bring Burke, author of *Oklahoma Health Center; a History* and feature Hershel Lamirand to the series.
